Weather & What to Pack

Mid-July on the LMU campus offers some of the most pleasant weather in Los Angeles:

- Daytime temperatures: **low–mid 70s°F (23–24°C)**
- Evenings: **cooling into the low 60s°F (16–17°C)**
- Coastal breezes and occasional marine layer keep things cool and comfortable
- It can get chilly at night, and several events will be outside, so bring a jacket!

Please check the forecast before your trip to get the latest weather updates.

What to bring:

- Light layers or a jacket (especially for evening outdoor events)
- Comfortable shoes for navigating campus
- Sunglasses (and if you forget—we’ve got you covered!)
- Water bottle to stay hydrated throughout the day (we will also have sustainable water cups)

Many of our receptions will take place at sunset with sweeping ocean and mountain views – one of LMU’s most iconic experiences.

Arriving in Los Angeles (LAX)

LMU is conveniently located just minutes from Los Angeles International Airport (LAX).

- **Distance:** ~8 minutes by car
- **Address:** Loyola Marymount University, 1 LMU Drive, Los Angeles, CA 90045

Ground Transportation:

- Upon arrival, follow signs to the **LAX-it** (pronounced “LA Exit”)
- Look for the **green LAX-it pillars** on the Lower/Arrivals Level curbside outside each terminal
- From there, you can access:
 - Taxi (recommended)
 - Rideshare (Lyft/Uber/Opoli)
- Note: Check with your hotel to learn where the complimentary hotel shuttles pick up.

Cost & Timing:

- Taxi to LMU: ~\$21–\$26 (**most economical option; best strategy for LEAVING airport**)
- Rideshare to LMU: typically higher (~\$35+)
- Return trip to the airport: Rideshare is often most economical—use Lyft or Uber
- Dynamic pricing is in play for Rideshares



Hotels & Airport Shuttles

Many LAX-area hotels offer **complimentary airport shuttle service** running frequently throughout the day.

Participating hotels include:

- Hyatt Regency LAX
- H Hotel (Curio Collection by Hilton)
- Embassy Suites (North & South)
- Holiday Inn LAX
- Sonesta
- Marriott Residence Inn LAX
- Homewood Suites by Hilton LAX

Note:

- Hotel June does **not** offer a shuttle; a taxi or rideshare is recommended.
